The Stanton Old Fashioned Days Committee and the City of Stanton want the festival to be fun and safe for everyone, so we ask that you please follow the quidelines below. For assistance, visit the Information Booth next to the former bank building or speak to any of our SOFD Volunteers, wearing teal shirts.

- Monitor your children at all times. Do not let them run into the street to pick up candy during parades.
- No riding bicycles or skate boards on sidewalks, closed streets, or other pedestrian areas. In these areas, you may walk your bike, park it in one of the many bike racks available, or carry your board.
- All pets must be on a leash and under the control of their person.
- Respect road closed signs/barriers and follow detour routes. This is for the safety of all who attend and participate in festival events. Moving or circumventing a barricade is a civil infraction under Michigan law.
- Local businesses will be open; use Pine or Walnut St, and side streets.
- No Drugs or Alcohol will be permitted at official events hosted by Stanton Old Fashioned Days.

2024 Grand Marshals

ANN & EVE WITZEL

"Bob's Boys" and eventually "The Witzel Girls," Ann & Eve Witzel are well-known faces in the Stanton community, yet they were still very surprised when they learned that they would have the honor of being Grand Marshals for this year's Stanton Old Fashioned Days Festival.

For Ann & Eve, the importance of service in the community was instilled in them from a young age as they helped their parents, Bob and Velma Witzel (2014 SOFD Grand Marshals) coordinate the annual Car Show that began well before the very first Old Fashioned Days Celebration in 1984. From there, both Ann and Eve participated in the Queen Contests in the 80s, and Ann went on to manage the Prince and Princess Contest for several years.

When asked what stands out among all of their involvements over the years the most, they both agreed that they are most proud of having started the Free Thanksgiving Dinners for the community. Over the years, this event has snowballed into Free Christmas Dinners, and eventually snowballed into Free Family Fun Days. These annual events are all accomplished through sales of an annual calendar that features hometown girls who volunteer for a themed photoshoot.

These events are all held at the Stanton American Legion, where they became involved early on as kids with the Junior Auxiliary, having a grandfather that served in WWII. Ann was even Miss Poppy in the mid 80s!

Ann's Styling Salon on Main Street has been in business for 36 years, with the last 24 of those years spent working alongside Eve. As for how they can still offer \$5 haircuts in 2024? They said they do A LOT of them, but again expressed the importance of providing a service to the community and making it affordable for all.

From growing up being referred to as The Witzel sisters both extended a huge thank you to the SOFD committee and all of the various organizations and volunteers who devote a huge effort all year round to ensure that we keep the Old Fashioned Days tradition alive and support the community, and they want to encourage anyone that comes out to the festival to also be considerate and appreciative of this.

> They also made a point to collectively give heartfelt credit to their parents. Eve shared, "We owe everything to our parents," as Ann explained, "If it wasn't for our parents, Eve and I wouldn't be what we are today. We have amazing parents-even better than Hallmark because they're REAL. They are who made us who we are."

> The Witzel family tradition of service is still alive and well in the next generation, as Eve's son Ike Hansen has stepped up to run this year's Soapbox Derby and Ann's son, Dino Stickney is excited to bring a Burnout Contest back to this year's Car Show...And we hear you won't want to miss the latter of those two events, since the Witzel Girls will be down at D Hale Brake Park burnin' up their own tires for the crowd's delight!



The "Real" Old Fashioned Days

There's no doubt about it; Stanton always has been and still is a very special place, for both those who have lived here all of their lives and those who have transplanted and put down new roots here. This is why the mission of our organization is to preserve the past, promote the present, and plan for the future heritage of the City of Stanton; and the means of doing this is through carrying on the annual Stanton Old Fashioned Days Festival.

As one of the founding members when Stanton Old Fashioned Days, Inc. was officially incorporated after its inaugural festival in 1984, Chuck Miel wrote a reflection after 35 years of festivals had been achieved, in which he stated that "It was decided to center this celebration around the fact that Stanton was over 100 years old and was itself somewhat old fashioned," and, thus, they named the festival accordingly.

It turned out that the different, old-fashioned feel of this community was also what made it so special, and this still rings true today. As a committee we have discussed "getting with the times" per se and fully moving to QR codes and webbased information, but true to our name, we still believe there is value in providing a good old-fashioned print copy of our annual booklet that can be leafed through at the leisure of it's reader.

And beyond that, the booklet seems to be a tradition in and of itself (and we're all about keeping traditions, of course). In fact, last year a woman from out of state contacted our Facebook page letting us know that she had found a copy of our 1985 program tucked away in a book among her mother's things that she was going through. She explained her mother would put pictures and other special items in books, and kindly offered to mail it. This little treasure has provided us with a sweet glimpse into the early days of Stanton Old Fashioned Days. It was actually distributed to Stanton merchants and marketed as a "Free Souvenir Program," and that it was, apparently.

This has inspired us to again make this year's festival program an interesting and special souvenir 40 years later—And with that, we'd like to share an excerpt from the 1985 booklet so you can understand what Stanton's "real" old fashioned days were like. Sources cited included Stanton Centennial 1963 edited by Carol Miel and Montcalm County Historical Society Bicentennial Edition.

STANTON

On March 2, 1831 the Legislative council of the territory of Michigan approved an act which provided for definite limits of a county named after Louis Joseph Marquis de Montcalm de Saint Veran, a french officer who was killed in the defense of Quebec in 1759. At that time Montcalm County functioned as parts of Kent, Ionia, St. Joseph and Kalamazoo Counties until 1850, at which time it began its career as an independent political unit of this state.

The first county seat, although temporary, was set up in Greenville with provisions made for the Board of Supervisors elected in 1860 to determine a permanent location. Much controversy grew throughout the county where the county seat should be located, and after much rivalry by a board vote of seven to three, it was decided it should be in the northeast 40 acres of Sidney Township. This was confirmed by a vote of the electorate, 504 supported, 374 opposed.

Those 40 acres were owned by Frederick Hall and were sold to the county for \$50, and in consideration of Hall's generosity, the town was then called Fred. Money

was spent clearing the area and the first Courthouse was built at a cost of \$765.00

It was now time for the County Seat's first Post Office and when Fred Hall received the application for the Post Office Department, he put "Stanton" in the blank open for name because of his great admiration for President Lincoln's Secretary of War. This change was officially recognized by the Michigan State Legislature in an act approved on February 23, 1863.

The early settlers of Stanton were primarily of Scandinavian and German decent, pioneers as they were, who came in Oxen drawn wagons, carrying their families possessions, cooking utensils and farming tools.

Wild game was very plentiful, of which venison provided the major part of the settlers' diet.

The first known settler of the Stanton area was a man by the name of Potter who came here in 1857 when there was nothing but pines. Looking north, east, south and west was a vast forest of white pine trees measuring 3 to $3\frac{1}{2}$ feet across and 150 ft. High. Timber such as this grew 50 to 65 trees per acre.

The Detroit, Lansing & Northern railroad that came here in 1871 brought lumbermen, realtors, storekeepers, lumberjacks, lawyers, doctors and tooth pullers onto Main Street.

The 3 story building shown is the The Bailey House hotel. Also, notice the steeple of the First Congregational Church, which is now celebrating its 150 year anniversary. →





← A postcard featuring the Pere Marquette Depot found on eBay and identified as having a 1910 copyright. A rendering of the same card on MiGenWeb notes that the "Stanton Centennial 1963" booklet stated that one of the trains ran from Saginaw to Grand Rapids and another from Stanton to Ionia.



Krantz Garden Tour

Anyone with a love of gardening or turned into a full blown addiction flowers won't want to miss the opportunity to visit this hidden oasis in the heart of Stanton. The Krantzes' famous gardens, located at 300 N. MILL ST., will be open both Friday and Saturday from 6 p.m. то 8:30 р.м. during the festival. The community is invited to spend some time enjoying the beauty of nature, so be sure to allot a good amount of time to tour the vast Krantz Garden.

Looking for a project to keep them busy, the Krantzes' garden was first started in 1996 with a couple of beds in their front yard. Without a lot of gardening experience the Krantzes started out as selfproclaimed, "trial and error gardeners," learning as they went.

In 1997 they purchased the lots behind their house, which, at the time, contained a large vegetable garden. Their original plan was to continue growing vegetables, but by the end of each summer the garden was full of weeds.

Around this time they also began planting flowers on some of the hills behind their house that were difficult to mow. As time went on and their gardens continued to expand and grow, the Krantzes learned the importance of mulching and planting the perennials close together to help control weeds.

By the spring of 2000, the Krantzes' little hobby of gardening had and the vegetable garden was officially turned into a flower garden, complete with grass paths. The Krantzes' garden is always changing and evolving, and each year something new is added.


Their first garden walk was in 2001 and they have been the talk of the town ever since. The Krantzes' garden was featured in the Summer 2011 issue of Country Gardens magazine and in the March 2014 issue of Better Homes & Gardens.

Be sure to take time to admire the planters downtown during the festival, and say thank you if you happen to see Peggy and Loren!

Please Note: Candy cannot be thrown from vehicles or floats; instead, candy and other items must be distributed by walkers closer to the crowd for the safety of children. All horse riders must supply a cleanup crew to follow directly behind their horses; streets must be clean for the car show, foot traffic, and food vendors following the parade.






