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Festival Guidelines

The Stanton Old Fashioned Days Committee and the City of Stanton want the festival to be fun and safe for everyone, so we ask that you please follow the guidelines below. For assistance, visit the Information Booth next to The Commons building or speak to any of our SOFD Volunteers wearing teal shirts.

- **Monitor your children at all times.** Do not let them run into the street to pick up candy during parades.
- **Respect road closed signs/barriers** and follow detour routes. This is for the safety of all who attend and participate in festival events. Moving or circumventing a barricade is a civil infraction under Michigan law.
- **No riding bicycles or skate boards** on sidewalks, closed streets, or other pedestrian areas. In these areas, you may walk your bike, park it in one of the many bike racks available, or carry your board.
- **Local businesses will be open;** use Pine or Walnut St, and side streets.
- **No Drugs or Alcohol** will be permitted at official events hosted by Stanton Old Fashioned Days.
- **All pets must be on a leash** and kept under their owner's control.



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2026 Grand Marshal

RONALD BLUM

Stanton Old Fashioned Days is pleased to honor Ronald Blum as this year's Grand Marshal. Anyone who knows Ron would say he is a kind-hearted man, committed to serving his community and country, and always wears a smile on his face.

Ron has been a part of the Stanton community for over 76 years. He spent his entire childhood here playing in town. He attended Central Montcalm High School and met some of his very best, life-long friends as well as his wife, Judy VanWagner. After graduation in 1968, Ron and Judy got married, planted roots here in town, raised their three children Jennifer, James, and Joylynn, and lived their entire marriage here in the town they knew and loved.

Ron's passion for serving his community started as a Stanton Boy Scout. Surrounded by World War II veterans and the local Stanton men, he was deeply influenced to continue serving. Ron became an Eagle Scout, served overseas in Vietnam, was trained by the 75th Ranger Battalion at Fort Benning, joined the Army Reserves and Michigan National Guard, became an assistant Boy Scout leader, completed Medical First Responder training, and joined the Specialized Emergency Rescue Team.

Throughout his life, Ron's jobs were also a testament to his service. He was a Stanton Department of Public Works employee, a part-time Stanton police officer, a Building Trades Instructor for the Department of Corrections, and he ran his own construction company. Ron's knowledge of construction allowed him to help so many: he and his students partnered with Habitat for Humanity to build and donate cabinets to local families, he traveled with the youth group from the First Congregational Church to both New York and Tennessee to help repair homes for families, he worked with the city for planning and zoning, drew up

plans for a new fire station, built new curbs for Stanton, remodeled and built many homes in town, assisted in hiring Stanton's first City Manager and he's been seen driving his dump truck during city-wide clean-ups.

When Ron finally retired from 20 years of service in the military and 25 years with the Department of Corrections, he found time to reflect. His wife, Judy, had saved nearly every letter, photo, and audio recording he had sent her from Vietnam. Ron re-read the letters and put his heart into writing his story, "Shattered Mirror," in hopes that sharing his experience could help other veterans who may have shared similar experiences. Upon the release of his book, Ron has been moved to honor local veterans with Quilts of Honor.

Ron is honored to be named Stanton Old Fashioned Days Grand Marshal. He cherishes his memories of the classic cars, pancake breakfasts, soapbox derby contests, talent shows, marching in the parades, running 10 K's, pine wood derby races... Ron looks forward to seeing the community come together to fill the streets, hear the hum of friendly conversations, laughter, and seeing all the events that will become treasured traditions for others as they have for him.

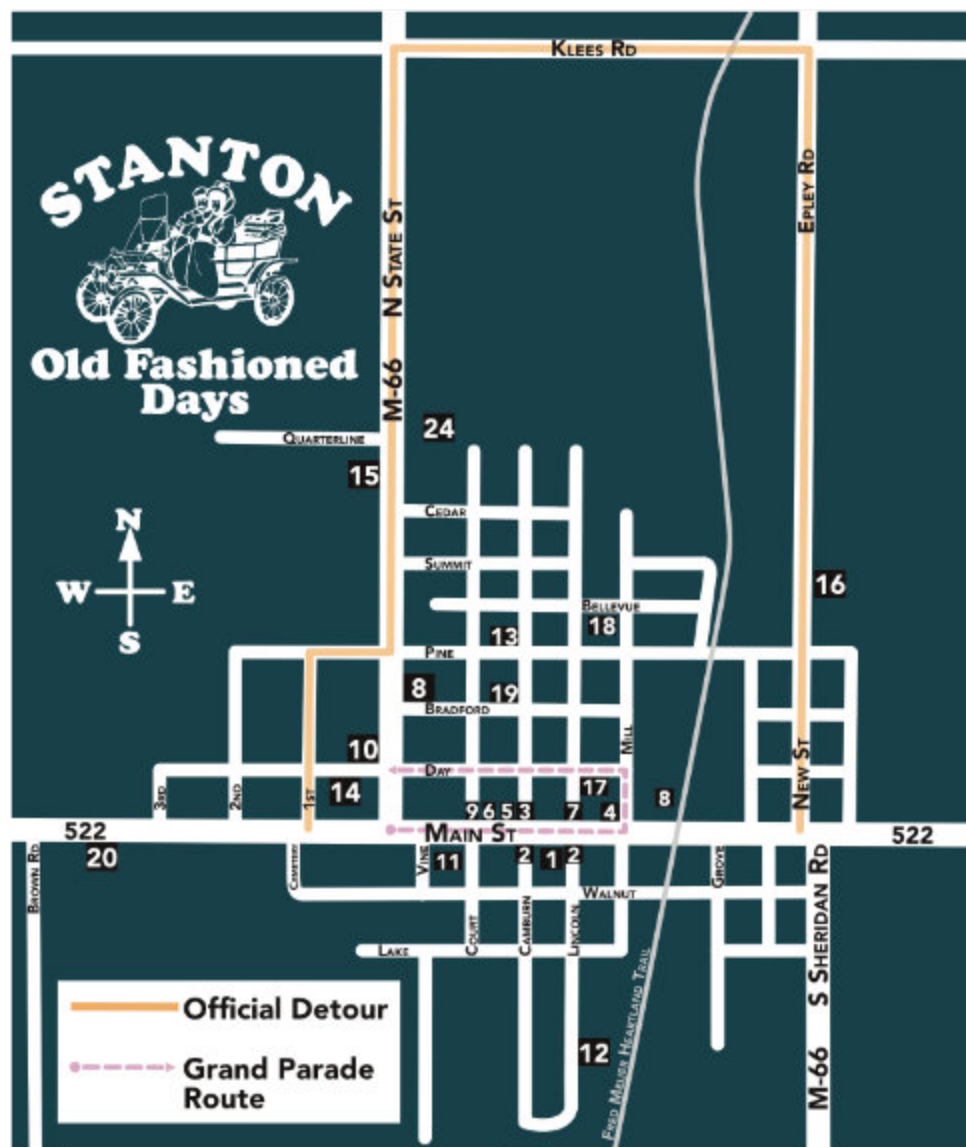

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Tractor Show

Tractors of all makes and models, including garden tractors, will line **MAIN STREET** on **SATURDAY** morning from **8:00 A.M. TO 10:45 A.M.** for the annual SOFD Tractor Show.

These tractors are treasured by their owners for their work capabilities, timeless design, and the memories they keep alive from times gone by. Many of the tractors on display are second and third generation owned. Come and experience some old fashioned farm history!

If bringing a tractor, no pre-registration is needed and there is no cost, but we ask that you please follow the procedures below:

TRACTOR SHOW PROCEDURES

1. Unload at the Montcalm Co. Road Commission starting at 7:00 A.M.
2. Proceed into town, stopping to fill out your photo card for the photographer and pose for your photo in front of the Courthouse.
3. Continue on Main Street to park for the show by 8:00 A.M.
4. Head to the booth in front of Baker Insurance to complete your registration process.
5. At 10:45 A.M., all tractors must exit Main Street. Those wishing to be in the parade will go back toward the Road Commission to turn around and return to the corner of M66 & Main Street heading east for parade lineup.

EXTENDED STAY OPTION:

For anyone wishing to keep their tractor on display in town after the show, there will be limited space available on S Court St (between Main Street and the rear drive into the Courthouse). Please do not move any barricades without assistance from law enforcement or SOFD event staff.



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Historic Home Tour

Stanton Old Fashioned Days is proud to continue the cherished festival tradition of the Historic Home Tour — a special way to honor our community's roots and recognize the homeowners who have worked to preserve a piece of Stanton's history.

This year's featured home sits at the northwest corner of Camburn and Pine Street (106 W Pine Street) and its story reaches back to the very founding of our town. The home was built by Henry Harrison Hinds, considered one of Stanton's original founders and a man whose life story reads like something from a history book. A Civil War veteran who served in the 57th Pennsylvania Volunteer Infantry, Hinds was wounded at Fredericksburg, taken prisoner at Gettysburg, and held at Libby Prison before making his way to Stanton after the war. Here he built a life in merchandising, lumbering, real estate, and farming; while simultaneously shaping the community around him as Township Supervisor, Village Guard, state-appointed school overseer, and elected State Senator for the 27th district.

The home itself reflected the character of the man who built it — substantial and thoughtfully appointed. It originally featured five bedrooms, a parlor, kitchen, dining room, living room, and a bath complete with a copper tub and marble bowl. The full basement included a plastered room where Mr. Hinds once stored milk from his farm.

The home has passed through many hands over the decades. Today, its new owner is in the process of lovingly renovating this piece of Stanton history and has welcomed a young family to make new memories within its walls. We are grateful for the opportunity to share it with you.

Tours will be available from **9:00 A.M. TO 11:00 A.M.** on **Saturday** at **106 West Pine Street**.

REGISTRATION INFO

Registration and staging is from **NOON TO 1:30 P.M.** at the corner of North M-66 and W Bradford St. (Please refer to the map below, and follow the signs for Car Show Registration.) For late entries, pull up to the barricade at N Court St from the north and wait to be directed to a spot. After parking, report to the relocated registration booth in front of The Commons building on Main Street.

Cost of entry is \$15. For details or to pre-register, visit stantonofd.com/car-show. Questions? Call Brandon at 989-287-0871.

SHOW PROCEDURES

When led onto Main Street by show coordinators, you may park starting at the Sunoco Station and onward to the east. Space between Millard's and the Courthouse is reserved for the Motorcycle Show. Judging will then take place for the awards ceremony, which is planned for 5:30 P.M.

When moving a vehicle at any time, car show participants are asked to please remember that safety is our #1 priority. Burnouts and tire chirping or squealing, outside of the events where they are allowed, are prohibited and will be monitored by law enforcement.

BURNOUT CONTEST
